FIRST READING Acts 8:26–40

An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." This is a desert place. ²⁷And he rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot." ³⁰So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. ³²Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this:

"Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he opens not his mouth. ³³In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth."

³⁴And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" ³⁸And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him. ³⁹And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he preached the gospel to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

EPISTLE 1 John 1:1-2:2




NICENE CREED

HOLY COMMUNION

- If you are a member of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and desire to take communion, please indicate on the Attendance Card found in the pew and place in the offering plate. Because participation in the Lord's Supper is a public declaration of the Christian Faith which is confessed at this altar (Acts 2:42; 1 John 1:3; 1 Tim. 1:3; 4:16; 6:3-10; 2 Tim. 1:13; Rom. 16:17) those who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, are asked to respectfully refrain from participation today and speak with a pastor after the Divine Service. If you are not communing but wish to receive a blessing, please cross your arms over your chest once you are kneeled at the communion rail.
- Both the common and individual cups are offered at each table simultaneously. If you desire the common cup, **please hold your hands open** and the Pastor will provide it to you, while the Elders serve the individual cups. It is proper to take hold of the cup when receiving the common cup. This helps prevent spilling and greatly assists the Pastor.

ALCOHOL-REMOVED WINE/GLUTEN-FREE WAFERS AVAILABLE

- For those who are allergic, or for health reasons, and unable to drink regular wine, alcohol-removed wine is available for Holy Communion. The alcohol-removed wine is white in color and in the individual cups in the center of each tray.
- Gluten-free wafers made from rice flour are also available. Please notify one of the pastors before the service that you would prefer the gluten-free option. The reception of this wine and the gluten-free wafers in no way affects the theological meaning or benefits of this Sacrament.

LORD'S SUPPER - If you are physically unable to get to church and would like to receive the Lord's Supper in your home, please contact the church office so that we can schedule a date and time with one of the pastors.

OUR TUESDAY MORNING MATINS SERVICES ARE NOW STREAMING ONLINE. For those who may wish to watch from home, the 10:00am Matins service will now be available online via our website, along with our other services.

TODAY at the end of our worship service, we will be hearing a ministry moment from Thomas Ibraheem and his wife Nadeen about the Christians of the Holy Land. They are part of Holy Land Christian Solidarity Cooperative and have visited hundreds of Lutheran Churches as part of their ministry. After the service we will be hosting, in the Parish Hall, a display of handmade olive wood religious articles from Bethlehem available for purchase. These carvings include olivewood Nativity sets, crosses, Christmas ornaments, candle holders, angels and many other religious crafts that could make a nice wedding, baptism, confirmation, Easter and Christmas gifts. The carvings are handmade by Christian families from Bethlehem who rely on it for their daily bread. More than 70% of the Christian Community in the Holy Land depend upon tourism as their only source of income. For decades those

Christians have been enduring many hardships as tourism in Bethlehem has plummeted and access to other sources of income has been sharply restricted due to the ongoing conflict, the wars, the thirty-six-foot wall built around Bethlehem, the COVID-19 pandemic, and nowadays the catastrophic ongoing war. Due to this, tourists are afraid and unable to visit the Holy Land. This made it very difficult for the Christian families to find their daily bread and forced them to immigrate and flee their homeland since they lost their source of income. The Christian population of the Holy Land was 30% in the last century, today it is less than 1%. If it continues like this, in few years we will find no Christians in the land of Christ, which could cause tragic consequences to our faith and holy sites.

THE AGAPE MINISTRY needed items: canned vegetables, canned fruit, peanut butter, jelly, mac & cheese, tomato sauce/pasta sauce, canned meat, soup, rice, dry beans (1–2-pound bags). Other needs are pasta, cereal, fresh or frozen meat, crackers, laundry detergent, hygiene items.

CHRISTIAN ASSISTANCE MINISTRY NEEDS ARE men's jeans, little boys clothing, large reusable shopping bags (bigger than grocery bags), people/groups to serve at CAM on Saturdays, weekly volunteers, monetary donations.

ANIMAL DEFENSE LEAGUE CURRENT NEEDS: Blankets (no comforters), newspapers, regular size towels (no hand towels), empty medicine bottles (remove label), Dog Treats, Canned Cat Food, Canned Dog Food, Bottles, KMR (1st step), Puppy Esbilac, Puppy pads, Miracle Nipples, Food scales, Heating pads, and Warming discs. **All food items should be unopened**. Please separate newspapers and empty medicine bottles **into bags**.
